From Bishop Brian's blog last November:

At our most recent General Convention this summer, we passed the following resolution:

Resolved, the House of Bishops concurring, That every Episcopal diocese, cathedral, church and mission shall invite their entire membership and people beyond their church to read the entire Bible in 2013 (C083).

Many faith communities have already begun or plan to begin soon. Some have chosen small group settings; others are encouraging families to engage in the yearlong endeavor. A significant number of folks are using the book *The Bible Challenge*, authored by The Rev. Marek P. Zabriskie, one of the main proposers of the resolution.

Regardless of the methodology or the grouping of participants, it is essential "to develop a life-long daily spiritual practice of reading the Bible in order to know God's love more clearly and to receive comfort, strength and guidance for daily living." (C083).

Daily reading of our sacred story has been a part my spiritual discipline for many years. It has in fact become my primary source of "strength and guidance for daily living" and so much more. My intention is to now augment my practice with the Bible Challenge with my family for the next year. I warmly encourage you to join me.

Here at St. Edward's, we invite you to join us in reading and praying the entire book of Psalms during Lent as part of your personal spiritual discipline and in partial answer to our Bishop's invitation.

Schedule

Below is a suggested schedule for reading the entire book of Psalms during Lent:

- Week 1:** Psalms 1-25
- Week 2:** Psalms 26-50
- Week 3:** Psalms 51-75
- Week 4:** Psalms 76-100
- Week 5:** Psalms 101-122
- Week 6:** Psalms 123-150



Gardening Angels

Surrounded as we are by bitter cold and wind, it is hard to imagine a field of daffodils or the unloading of trucks full of flowers for the Plant Sale. But they both will happen – suddenly, probably. Lent will be over, and we will wonder what we did with all that time. Along about April 1, matted-down, wet leaves must be pulled off the garden down front by the road. Believe it or not, there will be little green sprouts sticking up through those leaves! I've been doing it every year, but I need a helper.

Then we will see – is there rain or is it drought again? Drought will mean long, long hoses and tree bags and holey buckets. Pre-emergence crab grass and fertilizing must be done – we will hire that out. The two front lawns were in terrible shape at the end of last season. Are they retrievable, or must they be completely dug out and re seeded? Most of the bushes and trees have been planted for the time being. We will have one organizational meeting – gardeners, B&G chairman and just interested parties. Make the plans and get to work.

We do need more gardeners. Four acres is a lot to care for, but a couple of hours every week per gardening angel will give us a beautiful landscape. Beyond that – pray for those daffodils, then look for them on the hillside late April.

Outreach Updates

The William Project has ended – We were able to pay for bunk beds for William’s children. They were all very, very excited about this new furniture.

Vicksburg Commons – We continue to prepare and serve a meal once a month for the folk who live at Vicksburg Commons. Next serving is March 21. Sign up in the Gathering Space if you are interested in participating in the activity.

IOCP March Food Drive – During the entire month of March we will be collecting food and money for IOCP. For every item of food that brought in a local organization will donate \$1.00. With the food that is donated at St. Edward’s we will build a “sculpture” which will then be entered into a contest that is sponsored by IOCP. Please bring food or money and come help with the sculpture. Work on the sculpture will happen after the 9:30 service each morning.

Sandwich crew – Several members of St. Edward’s regularly make sandwiches and snack bags at St. Mark’s Cathedral. This food is distributed to homeless folk in the Minneapolis. Many of them are students at Metropolitan Community and Technical College.

Easter baskets for IOCP clients – As in the past, we will once again fill Easter baskets on Palm Sunday morning. Please bring baskets, toys, wrapped candy and other appropriate items to support this project.

Breakfast Serving – On Saturday, March 2, several people from St. Edward’s will be serving breakfast to clients (between 14 – 20) who are currently being housed at St. Philip the Deacon Lutheran Church. This is a part of the Families Moving Forward project. Please talk with Chip Whitacre if you are interested in this project.

Summer Mission to Cuba

As part of its mission, the Episcopal Church in Minnesota seeks to strengthen its relations with the people and faith communities of Cuba. Our relations with the Episcopal Church in Cuba date from 1870, when Bishop Henry Whipple visited there, ministered to the poor, and recommended the creation of a Cuban mission to the House of Bishops. For the past decade, mission groups from Minnesota have gone to Cuba to assist their projects with funds and volunteer work. This year, the Mission will arrive on June 15 and return on June 23. There are spaces for only 24 Missioners in our Religious Visa for this trip. Because of the unique constrictions upon travel between the United States and Cuba, we will need all commitments and deposits in by March 15, 2013.

Tuesday, February 12, 2013: 6:30 pm

OPENING PRAYER/MEDITATION

Meeting started at 6:39 p.m. with the reading of the Collect of Transformation

APPROVAL OF JANUARY MINUTES (6:40-6:45)

Amy made a motion to approve the minutes; Fran seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS REPORT – FRITZ (6:45-7:00)

Judy Starkey – lawn seeding

Judy is concerned that the front lawns have gotten worse and worse. It is now all crabgrass. She has spoken to TruGreen. They will kill all the existing crabgrass, then it will need to be rototilled and then re-seeded. Judy stated that she would give a donation to complete this task. The church will need to maintain the watering of the lawns.

Fritz reiterated Judy's proposal. It was suggested that pre-emergence be used on the rest of the grounds. We also need the bushes and trees re-fertilized. Judy will make a donation for this task as well. Fertilization estimate is \$250.

Fritz questioned whether or not Trugreen will rototill. He asked for an estimate from Trugreen.

Fran expressed concern that the pre-emergence stunted the growth of the peonies. Judy hopes that they will come back.

Fritz asked that all money be tracked. The Staff Team has developed a form "Fundraising/Project Application Form". Judy stated that she has kept a record of what she has done in the past. Fritz states that he would like to have a formal proposal to track expenses. This way the expectation is set from the beginning regarding expenses.

Judy stated that she is available to help as a Buildings and Grounds On-Call Volunteer.

Judy will submit an application form for the "Front Lawn" Project. Fritz and Judy will determine the best time to plant the grass seed.

John Marchewka made the motion. Fran Christian-son seconded the motion. Resolution approved unanimously.

MMS Request update (Ginny – Doug Sparks communicated to Ginny that they are having a meeting in late February and our MMS relief will be discussed. We hope to have an answer after that.

Kudos to Gary on correcting Xcel energy sales tax issue!! Xcel will credit the bill. We will have approximately three months of no energy bills.

Ginny made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report; Fritz seconded the motion. All in attendance approved.

REVENUE STREAMS WORK GROUP (7:15-7:30)**Trish Martin – Plant Sale**

Lynne spoke about the Plant Sale. She stated that she needs our support. She really needs volunteers. Please help in passing out the brochures to draw more support. If each person could bring in two more people, we could raise \$40 x 80 sales = \$3200.

Trish stated that adding a second weekend helped the sales.

Fritz asked about the pricing. Trish stated that the pricing is advised by Floyd.

Dates – May 5th through May 12th. (Tents up on Friday, May 3rd.) Fritz, Trish, and Lynne will determine a day to meet for a planning meeting.

Volunteers to form new Vestry working group – Revenue Streams – Fritz and Ginny volunteered to be a part of the group. Mother Danáe is focused on the labyrinth and will join the group for that purpose. Chip has a contact regarding the use of the building. An idea for a caterer arose. The caterer and the building will need a license. A license would take approximately 30 days. Chip suggested that we bring some parishioners into the group as well. Ginny stated that the idea would be reviewed at the first meeting.
