About the Vestry

Are you called to serve?

Here are some guidelines of the Vestry job description. See opposite page to learn how a Vestry fits into Episcopal Church governance.

All vestry members should strive to the best of their abilities to:

- Have a love of God and demonstrate a commitment to following the way of Christ;
- Be active in and knowledgeable about the congregation, its programs and governance;
- Be fair, interact well with people and strive to earn the respect of the members of the congregation;
- Purposefully strive to "check one's ego at the door;"
- Purposefully strive to be a servant of the people without the need to be the "most important person" in the congregation or the need to be the one with the right answers to everything;
- Have enthusiasm and vitality for this ministry.

All vestry members should be able to make the following time commitments:

- Vestry meetings, committee work;
- Vestry retreat(s);
- Weekly worship services (rotating occasionally if more than one);
- Congregational events: coffee hours, meals, fundraisers, adult education programs, etc.;
- Diocesan meetings, as necessary;
- Annual meeting.

All vestry members are responsible for:

- · Offering talents to support the congregation's ministry;
- · Praying daily for the priest, leaders, and members of the congregation;
- · Pledging financial support early in the stewardship campaign;
- Being active ministers of the Gospel in daily life and work;
- Bringing one's whole self to the table; being present mind, body, and spirit;
- · Risking openness with one's ideas, beliefs and desires.

If this sounds like something you would be interested in, please prayerfully consider submitting your name to the Vestry in one of the following ways **by November 25**: You can verbally tell a Vestry member or Mo. Danáe that you are interested and why; You can leave a note in Mo. Danáe's box with the same information; You can e-mail Mo. Danáe or one of the Vestry members to let them know your interest.

Anonymous nominations will not be accepted. If you wish to nominate someone else, please speak with them to see if they are willing to consider the nomination. Only then will the nomination be accepted. Nominations will be approved by vote in the Annual Meeting in January.

William Project – There is no new specific news about William and his family. This is good news. This project will be completed by the end of December.


Loaves & Fishes – The next time we serve is Wednesday, January 31, 2013.

Adopt-a-Family

As in the past, St. Edward's is once again participating in the Adopt-a-Family program that is sponsored by IOCP. This is a program that helps brighten the holiday season for low income families in our local community. The schedule for this program is listed below:

- Sunday, November 18 The "wish list" of needs/wants for each individual are listed on the bulletin board in the Gathering Space. Parishioners are asked to take the wish list that they would like to donate and then do the shopping for such. It is suggested that sponsors follow a \$50 a person guideline.
- Sunday, December 2 Gifts should be returned to the Gathering Space. They should be wrapped individually, with a tag with the person's first name on each gift. Please also include a gift receipt with each gift or put all of the gift receipts together with one separate envelope.
- Friday, December 7 The gifts will be delivered to the IOCP office.

ERD responds to Sandy

Episcopal Relief & Development (ERD) continues to reach out to impacted partners in the Caribbean and along the eastern coast of the US. At least 69 people have died in the Caribbean due to the storm, and flooding is widespread. In the US, the storm has killed at least 17 people in six states, and left 6 million without power. St. Edward's Vestry Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, October 9, 2012: 6:30-8:30 pm

Priest: Mother Danáe Ashley ~ Deacon-in-training: Chip Whitacre

Members: John Marchewka, Dwight Maxa (absent), Thomas Mitchell (absent), Hollie Yeager, Ginny Cassidy, Julie Smith (Clerk), Fran Christianson, Gary Englert (Treasurer) (absent)

Mother Danáe opened the meeting at 6:40 p.m.

Hollie made a motion to approve the September meeting minutes as amended with an update to the date as Tuesday, September 11. Ginny seconded and the motion to approve the amended minutes carried.

Treasurer's Report

Another good month financially from the standpoint the income nearly matched expenses; and our ending cash position remained flat to August. Overall total expenses are \$6500 below budget. However, by the end of the year we will have used \$20,000 from our cash reserves to meet our operating costs. Gary forecasts that the general fund will be negative by \$1,025 by the end of the year, which means borrowing monies from the dedicated funds in December.

Gary made a recommendation to close the 3 Dedicated Accounts that have a total balance of \$445.95 and transfer the residual balances to the General Fund. Hollie made a motion to approve moving the funds and Ginny seconded. The motion carried.

Gary also proposed a framework to put the \$5400 we received as a one-time gift as follows. Designated uses:

- Major repairs and/or maintenance to building and grounds
- Fund supply priest during contractual Sabbatical of Rector/Priest in Charge
- Seed money for endowment fund, capital campaign fund or major outreach effort

Fran made a motion to approve the framework and Hollie seconded it and the motion carried.

Gary will draft a policy for review and approval.

Stewardship begins with a simple question: What are we called to do?

This spring, St. Edward's received a wonderfully succinct and compelling answer from our identity exercise with Father Tim Hodapp:

Search, Serve, Celebrate,

Our unique promise – to live Christ's compassion in community – is realized when we grow spiritually, reach out to others, and worship God together.

Through surveys and conversations, we identified elements that parishioners feel are critical to fulfilling our promise. They include:

- Celebrating our Episcopal heritage, which includes employing a full-time priest and a one-quarter time music director.
- Providing ministries to connect our growing faith in meaningful ways, fellowship and education for all generations, including childcare for our youngest members.
- Sharing our abundance of talent and treasure with those in need through outreach.
- Exercising fiscal responsibility.

But the reality is, no matter if we add to our numbers or not, we must continue to be faithful to God's mission for us on this corner of County Road 6 and Ferndale Road North.

And here's what's exciting: Our vision for 2013 includes more than just a balanced budget. It includes more than being able to continue to retain Mo. Danáe as a full-time priest next year. More than keeping our music director, parish administrator, bookkeeper, and sexton's hours steady. More than just having our doors open on Sunday. We have a call from God. God's vision is emerging and our mission is clear: To spread the Gospel by feeding our local community spiritually, physically, and artistically. We are creative, tenacious, open-hearted people that are committed to God's work for us here. You are a vital part of this vision. So, let's fill up our labyrinth with support as we continue to call St. Edward's home!

From Chip Whitacre, our Deacon in Training

Last week, as I sat at the desk in our home office, I noticed a squirrel that jumped from the roof of the house to what seemed to me to be a flimsy branch on one of the trees nearby. The branch sagged under the weight of the squirrel as it landed, but it held and the squirrel scampered onto the tree trunk without incident.

The squirrel's ultimate objective was the bird feeders that we have behind our house and the bounty that they provide to all who come, not only squirrels, but chipmunks, turkeys, raccoons and the various species of birds that come in to feed. A whole community gathers right outside our kitchen window to eat. The simple act of putting out the feeders and filling them periodically has produced a place for a community to gather.

In our community, IOCP is the place where people who are struggling can gather for help. The simple idea of caring what happens to our neighbors and acting on it has developed into a

vibrant service center for those in our community who need a helping hand. But keeping an operation with the scope of IOCP going is not so simple. It takes a whole community of donors and volunteers and a staff to coordinate their efforts

On November 10 IOCP will kick off the Sleep Out, the annual campaign to raise funds so that IOCP can continue to help those who are struggling with food, shelter, clothing, educational support, and family guidance. The event will begin with a celebration in Klapprich Park in Wayzata and conclude on December 31. The goal of this year's Sleep Out is \$1.95 million. The work that IOCP does in our community is critical to helping people in times of need, but also in the on-going effort to help them develop the capacity to get out of poverty.

These are difficult times and the need is great and growing. Unemployment is high and wages are declining while the cost of food is skyrocketing. The number of children in our local school district who qualify for free and reduced lunches has tripled in the last ten years. The shelters for those who are without homes are overflowing and the number of families that are having to resort to sleeping on the streets or in their cars is rising dramatically.

The Outreach Committee is discussing how St. Edward's might best support the Sleep Out in 2012 and your ideas are welcomed. Small as we are our contribution is important. This month, as we pause to reflect on the many blessings for which we are thankful, I urge each of you to consider how you might join the Outreach Committee in supporting the work of IOCP.
